DAY 1



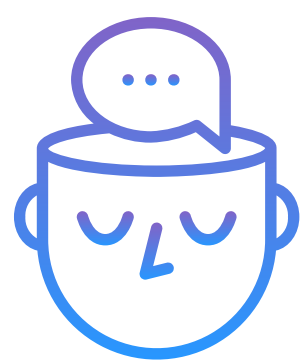
REQUEST

Take 10-15 minutes and read all of Titus.



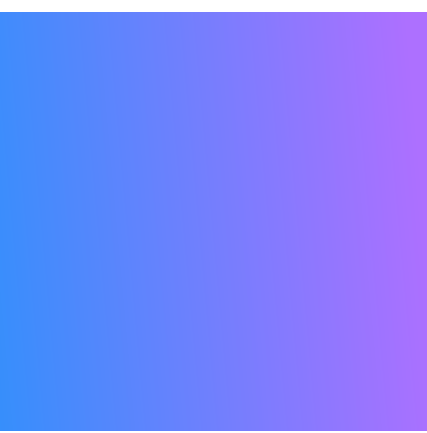
REFLECT

DAY 2



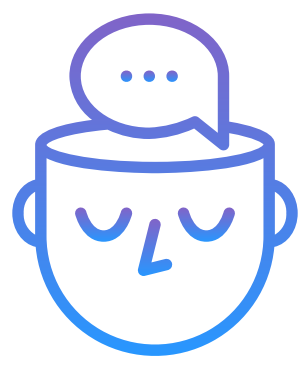
REQUEST

Ask the Lord to bless your time in His Word by helping you understand and apply its truth to your life.



READ

Titus 1:1-9



REFLECT

How does Paul describe his calling? What does he reveal about the character of God?

What does Paul say an elder must be and not be? What does Paul say an elder must do and not do?

What aspects of verses 5-9 do you think should be a goal of all Christians and not just elders?
In what areas are you weak?



RESPOND

Write your application as a prayer (Ex. Lord help me to...).



REMEMBER

He must hold firm to the trustworthy word as taught, so that he may be able to give instruction in sound doctrine and also to rebuke those who contradict it. Titus 1:9



DAY 3



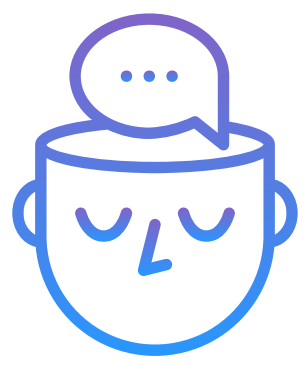
REQUEST

Ask the Lord to bless your time in His Word by helping you understand and apply its truth to your life.



READ

Titus 1:10-16



REFLECT

What should be the response of church leadership to false teachers?

Why do you think this is important?

What does Paul say about the false teachers' motives and character in 1:11–13?

List a few contrasts between the false teachers and qualified elders in 1:6–9.

According to 1:16, what is the ultimate evidence of genuine faith? How does Paul describe those who profess to know God and deny Him by their works (verse 16)? How does this compare to the “elect” described in verse 1?



RESPOND

Write your application as a prayer (Ex. Lord help me to...).



REMEMBER

They profess to know God, but they deny him by their works. They are detestable, disobedient, unfit for any good work. Titus 1:16



DAY 4



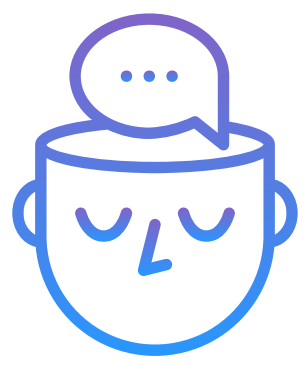
REQUEST

Ask the Lord to bless your time in His Word by helping you understand and apply its truth to your life.



READ

Titus 2:1-10



REFLECT

To what groups does Paul give instruction in verses 1-10?

What is the goal of such behavior in the church (verse 1, 5b, & 10)?

Why do you think Paul repeatedly stresses the need for these various groups of Christians to display self-control (2:2, 5, 6) and proper speech (2:3, 8, 9)?

How do the issues of self-control and speech relate to the doctrinal and moral problems of the churches in Crete (1:10–16)?

We are to live holy lives to make the gospel look good to others. In what overt ways does your life reveal you have been transformed by the truth of the gospel?



RESPOND

Write your application as a prayer (Ex. Lord help me to...).



REMEMBER

Show yourself in all respects to be a model of good works, and in your teaching show integrity, dignity, and sound speech that cannot be condemned, so that an opponent may be put to shame, having nothing evil to say about us. Titus 2:7-8



DAY 5



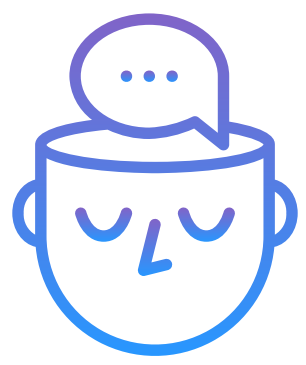
REQUEST

Ask the Lord to bless your time in His Word by helping you understand and apply its truth to your life.



READ

Titus 2:11-15



REFLECT

How do verses 11–14 relate to the instructions to various groups in the church in verses 2–10?
How does the gospel of grace empower God’s people for good works?

How does Titus 2:11–14 summarize our past, present, and future as Christians?

How frequently do you reflect on the promise of Jesus Christ’s return? How does “our blessed hope” (future) relate to our lives today (present)?



RESPOND

Write your application as a prayer (Ex. Lord help me to...).



REMEMBER

For the grace of God has appeared, bringing salvation for all people, training us to renounce ungodliness and worldly passions, and to live self-controlled, upright, and godly lives in the present age. Titus 2:11-12



DAY 6



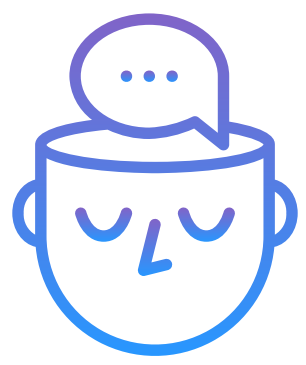
REQUEST

Ask the Lord to bless your time in His Word by helping you understand and apply its truth to your life.



READ

Titus 3:1-15



REFLECT

What seven practices are commanded in verses 1-2?

Why is it important for Paul to remind Christians that they were once foolish, disobedient, led astray, enslaved by sin, envious, and hateful (3:3-7)? List the contrasts between the attitude and actions called for in verses 1–2 and believers.

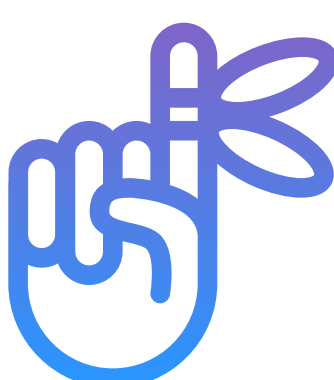
If Christians are saved not because of their works but because of God's mercy (3:5), why does Paul repeatedly call believers to devote themselves to good works (2:7, 14; 3:8, 14)?

How do good works relate to our mission and calling in the world (3:1)?



RESPOND

Write your application as a prayer (Ex. Lord help me to...).



REMEMBER

But when the goodness and loving kindness of God our Savior appeared, he saved us, not because of works done by us in righteousness, but according to his own mercy, by the washing of regeneration and renewal of the Holy Spirit. Titus 3:4-5



DAY 7

Ask the Lord to bless your time in His Word by helping you understand and apply its truth to your life.



READ

Take 10-15 minutes and read all of Titus again.



REFLECT

Summarize the book again now that you have studied it.

What is the most significant lesson you've learned from your study of Titus?



RESPOND

Write your application as a prayer (Ex. Lord help me to...).
